



## Graduate Entry Veterinary Medicine Selection Process – 2024 entry

The RVC receives in excess of 1900 applications each year for approximately 250 places on our D100, D101 and D102 courses. We are committed to selecting our students using fair and transparent processes. As the majority of our applicants meet or exceed our academic entry requirements, we have developed selection methods which we believe enable us to recruit the students most suited to our degree programme.

- Where they are still studying for their degree, their average mark for their first and second year (as calculated on their RVC transcript) is 60% or higher
- If they have graduated, they achieved a final classification of 2:1 or higher

The automatic offer of an interview will have no subsequent influence on the likelihood of an offer and all RVC students will be considered for an offer in the same way as any other interviewed applicant.

The process of offer making to applicants will start in January, although most applicants can expect to hear from us in early to mid-February. Offer making is a gradual process and therefore applicants should refrain from drawing conclusions from the fact they have not heard but others have. Applicants will receive an email offer from the RVC which will outline any terms of their offer, their fee status and provide other important information about the next steps they need to take. An update will also be made via UCAS Track, where applicable.

## **8. Results and Clearing**

A decision on an application will be made upon receipt of evidence that conditions have been fulfilled (to be provided by the applicant).

Only applicants who meet the full terms of their offer are guaranteed to be accepted; applicants who narrowly miss their results may be accepted on occasion, should a vacancy occur, but this is by exception rather than the norm. The RVC can offer no guarantees this will happen in any given year and cannot guarantee that any applicants who do not meet the full terms of their offer will be accepted onto the course.

Decisions will be made following receipt of results, consideration of the applicant's grade profile and vacancies on the course. This decision is final and therefore applicants who are unsuccessful should refrain from calling the Admissions Office unless their grades subsequently change due to a remark. Applicants who are successful will receive email confirmation of this and do not need to contact the Admissions Office for further verification.

The RVC's veterinary medicine courses do not enter Clearing.
